Focus on: Vacancy in Emmanuel International (EI) Water and Sanitation Engineer, Tanzania

EI has been working in partnership with the Anglican Diocese of Ruaha (DR) in Iringa for many years, assisting with physical and spiritual development projects. A crucial need of many of the rural communities in this area is clean water. EI/DR have constructed gravity water supply systems in several communities as well as rainwater harvesting at rural schools and health care centres.

Duration of commitment

Preferably two or more years

Responsibilities


- Oversee water and sanitation projects, including planning, sourcing and supply of materials, budgeting and reporting, and coordinating hygiene and sanitation training.
- Work alongside the Water and Sanitation Project Officer to supervise technicians in the field, and report to the EI team leader.
- Liaise with staff of the Diocese in the field as well as at the head office in Iringa, and develop relationships with members of the church and the wider community in the field.
- Develop networks with other stakeholders in water and sanitation in Tanzania and beyond, as well

as evaluating existing systems and researching alternative technologies.

Requirements

Degree or higher diploma (requirement to obtain residence permit for Tanzania). A background in engineering, construction, or project management would be an asset. A committed Christian faith is essential. Driving licence is required.

Please keep these concerns in your daily prayers...

- 1 Philippines:** The next planting season for the farmers in Cabagan, Isabela starts in the first 2 weeks in November. Please pray as they replant their crops that have been destroyed in the typhoon, and that we will have sufficient cash flow in order to help those that need help in planting the next season's crops.
- 2 United Kingdom:** The EIUK Board is meeting today in London. Please pray for safety in travels as some board members come from quite far away.
Canada: Fitzroy Gordon, CEO of G 98.7 FM Radio Station in Toronto and a supporter and friend of EIC, is recovering from a challenging stroke. He is now out of hospital at home recovering. Pray for the medical staff treating him as he begins his road to recovery - for full recovery and for God to use his healing powers and to bless him and his wife.
- 3 Philippines:** The financial audit is commencing and your prayers will be appreciated.
Malawi: The members of the PROMISE program are hosting the Annual Work Plan Conference from November 4-10 with participants from Ghana and Rwanda. Kristy Nowell from EI Canada is a part of this group. Pray for wisdom, clarity and unity.
- 4 United Kingdom:** Simon and Victoria Ewing, on furlough, will be speaking at St John the Baptist Church in Rowland's Castle today.
Canada: Our auditors are in the office to do the Annual Audit. Please pray for a very successful report.
- 5 Tanzania:** The Ewing family travel back to Mwanza from the UK today. Pray for safe travels and as they settle back into life here.
Haiti: Please pray for calm and tranquillity after unrest in mid-October due to PetroCaribe fuel scandal implicating members of the current government.
- 6 Uganda:** The Bishop Lee Theological College will be holding their final exams from November 5th to 12th. After completing their exams there will be a retreat for the graduating students and their spouses. The graduation has been scheduled tentatively for November 18th. Pray for these students, that they will perform well and remember what they have learned, but even more importantly that they will be strong and godly leaders as they go back to their churches!
- 7 Canada:** Laura Kelly is departing for her journey to Tanzania today. She is very excited to be on her way to Africa, finally! Pray for safety and for Laura to have a blessed time working in the EI Project. May God bless her!
Haiti: The recovery after the magnitude 5.9 earthquake on October 6 in northern region remains active.
- 8 Philippines:** We (Ken and Ruth Copsey) praise God for having a great furlough so far. Please pray for us this November. We will be speaking/sharing at different churches around the Monterey, California area on November 11, 18 and 25. Pray for safety as we travel and that we will be a blessing to those who have been supporting us and our ministry all these years.

- 9 Tanzania:** We are excited to welcome Laura Kelly to the Mwanza team! Pray for her as she settles in Mwanza, looks for a home, starts to build relationships and learn Swahili.
- South Africa:** Our church is camping this weekend. It has been 5 years since we've had a church camp but we look forward to coming together around God's word and to grow closer as a church family, where we can learn more about how to build one another up. Pray for a wonderful weekend of bonding and growth.
- 10 Malawi:** The Advisory Council will be gathering today for an extraordinary meeting to discuss the next steps for EI Malawi. Pray for God's wisdom and a spirit of unity.
- 11 Tanzania:** We are starting a rainwater harvesting project at the church in Mangawe to capture and store water from the roof of the church to help supply the need for clean drinking water. Mangawe is a very dry and hot area where water is scarce. We are grateful for the support from the church in Brazil to make this project possible. Please pray that we will be able construct the tanks in time to harvest water this coming rainy season.
- 12 South Africa:** Praise God for 3 new children referred to our 3rd Safe House. Florida has two girls, 8 months and an 8 years old, and a 5 year old boy. The two older ones have come from a very neglected past with obvious physical and emotional scars. It has been a true blessing to welcome them into the home and begin forming a new family of love and trust. The Department of Social Services has also requested we take another 8 year old girl and we are going to the court later this week to sign the documents.
- 13 Philippines:** We are hoping to help Cabagan farmers with the construction of a well to help them water their crops this season.
- 14 Brazil:** Praise God for his blessings on Propac Day Care Center and how children and their parents are helped.
- 15 Malawi:** Pray for Charles Mukiwa (Acting Country Representative) and Brereton Mitambo (Administrator) as they take over the roles and responsibilities that have been with Paul and Helen.
- 16 Uganda:** The Diocese of Kitgum will hold the consecration ceremony for the new Bishop on the 25th of November, but there are still a lot of preparations to finish before that day. The cathedral is being renovated and the Bishop's house is still being completed, as well as organizing work for the day itself. We are praying for unity in the church, and that the new Bishop will receive the support he needs for the Diocese to move forward after a difficult transition.
- 17 Tanzania:** The Upendo wa Mama group is selling at the Mwanza Charity Fair this weekend. Pray for good sales and also for all the new things this group is starting to do. Students at Cardiff University are now starting to work on marketing the group and products as part of an art and design project. Also pray for work underway to start a social enterprise bakery.
- Brazil:** The Terena Indigenous Conference for Pastors is to be held today. The main speaker is Pr. Christian Gillis, from Belo Horizonte. Please pray for them as they meet together.
- 18 Haiti:** The mission continues to seek a pastor for the Font Blanc church, the largest church in Cabaret. The Cabaret school is likewise searching for a principal.

- 19 Philippines:** Our Christmas fundraising efforts need to raise sufficient funds to contribute at least some groceries for the Nochebuena meal on Christmas Day, to some 300 families in 3 churches.
- 20 South Africa:** Rachel and Nathan have still not heard about their visas, though Don, Danielle and Hudson have received theirs. It's been 4 months since they've applied. It is impossible to get more information since Home Affairs no longer allows visa applicants to visit their offices. Submissions are done via a 3rd party and then forwarded to Home Affairs. The 3rd party has no access to Home Affairs information. Very frustrating.
- 21 Brazil:** The Terena Bible School plans to renew their classrooms and would appreciate your prayers.
- 22 Tanzania:** Members of the entrepreneurship projects on Ukerewe Island need to raise 20% towards their projects. Pray for them to make the effort to do this seriously.
- 23 Tanzania:** In the Lupembelswasenga water project we have started laying pipe for the distribution system, which will be the final stage of construction. Please pray that the project will be completed in good time and within budget, and that the water supply system can be handed over to the community and its Water Users Association that is being trained to manage the system.
- 24 Philippines:** The scholarship programme needs to raise enough funds to enable us to help 2 partner churches who are waiting with their scholars to receive our assistance.
- 25 Uganda:** In the final week of November our office will be setting aside time to work on 2018 annual reports, and budget and work plans for 2019. We pray for wisdom and guidance as we seek God's will for EIUganda in 2019.
- 26 Haiti:** It is praise-worthy to note that the leadership transition is progressing well: high school students of the Marbial school continue to perform well on National state exams and the church plant is going well in Katoman.
- 27 Tanzania:** Joel Newby and Simon and Victoria Ewing need to renew their work and residence permits. This is getting increasingly more complicated and difficult. Please pray for speed and ease for this process.
- 28 South Africa:** Pray that we could form more partnerships in South Africa and back home to continue to grow these vital ministries. It has been a difficult couple of years but we trust God will draw more people to this ministry, in His time.
- 29 Tanzania:** The IMARIKA project is working with four new groups for a total of nine communities. Pray for the formation of the groups in Mafuluto, Lupembelwasenga, Usolanga, and Magozi and the trainings they will receive. Pray that the tree nurseries will produce lots of tree seedlings to plant in January and for our conservation agriculture trainings to help farmers understand the value of improving soil fertility.
- 30 Tanzania:** The Mwanza team are hoping to offer the Church and Transformation seminar to the BMCC church in Mwanza. Pray for all the participants as well as all those teaching.
