- **2 Brazil:** Praise the Lord for the Emmanuel Brazil general meeting. We had a great time of fellowship and discussion of important things for the mission.
- **Tanzania:** Louisa is travelling on a school trip (May 3-6) through the Serengeti to Ngorogoro Crater. Please also continue to pray for the girls' school which has been under great threat over recent months.
- **4 Malawi:** Praise God for initial funds to get started on the Bimbi Irrigation Scheme. We are really looking forward to God's blessing over this land and the people in this area who are being served by the Word of Grace Church.
- **Tanzania:** The Lupembelwasenga water project completed the installation of the solar pumping system. In May the upper balancing tanks will be constructed and the community will be digging trenches for the distribution system.
- **6 United Kingdom:** The Rolletts are speaking at churches today and the next two Sundays. Please pray for them as they juggle the demands on them as parents of a toddler and a newborn baby with that of meeting with supporters and friends and family.
- **7 Uganda:** Milly and Mike are planning for the second term of the pads ministry, including first steps towards creating sustainability. Please pray.
- **8 Tanzania:** Amisadai travels to Rwanda for a school trip until Saturday the 12th. They will be visiting the Genocide Memorial amongst other things.
- **9 Tanzania:** This month we may be starting to harvest crops with our farmers in the Mwanza region. Please pray for good harvests and good record-keeping! Our prayer is that lives would be transformed through this project and the harvest is a wonderful time to celebrate the goodness of God!

- 10 Canada: Praise God for positive movement forward for Scott and Lorilee MacLean to move to Malawi first in January 2019 before finally moving into Mozambique under the Evangelical Baptist Church of Mozambique at a later date.
