Our work has been affected by the spread of COVID-19. Life is uncertain at the moment and many events cancelled in our project countries. People cannot move as freely as before.

Please pray every day for those affected by the coronavirus.

- 1 South Africa: Don Sayers is taking on more teaching this month in a Marriage Counselling course and in the pulpit Sunday Mornings. He is also finalizing year end for African Hope Trust and Emmanuel South Africa, so it will be a busy patch.
- **Malawi:** We want to thank God for the partnership we have had with Villages in Partnership. As they move to be independent from October 1, lets pray for continued stability between El Malawi and VIP.
- **3 Brazil:** El Brazil is involved with the distribution of another 400 food packages to poor families that had their income affected by COVID-19 pandemic. 500 children will also receive a special kit with a Bible story coloring book, coloring pencils, a simple toy and some candies. Our prayer is that each family and child would feel God's love and care for them when they receive the food packages and kits.
- **4 Tanzania:** In October we will start preliminary seminars for the IMARIKA Project in A new village called Mlowa. Please pray for us to have good cooperation with the community.
- **Tanzania:** Joel and Elisha will be doing field visits in the Magu district for the new entrepreneurship projects.
- **6** South Africa: Rachel Sayers injured her back last month falling from a broken ladder. Please continue to pray for her. An MRI last months showed she has some degenerative problems on her spine. She is still in pain most of the day but is mobile with rests throughout the day.
- **Tanzania:** Laura Kelly is returning to Mwanza today for her second term of service. Pray she has safe travels and that her residency permit will soon be approved. We are thankful that she has been given a renewed work permit. Also pray for Laura as she settles back into life in Mwanza.
- **8** United Kingdom: A second wave of COVID-19 is looming over the UK. People have been urged to work from home again. Please pray that it can be curbed and that we can return to some sense of normality.
- **9 Uganda:** Michael and Marianne Botting are back in Uganda, after a repatriation flight and quarantine. Please pray for them to settle back into life and ministry in Uganda.
 - **Tanzania:** Peter, Bhatendi, and Elisha will be following up all the churches where they taught in during the month of September.

- **10 Philippines:** September was the end of our financial year. Please pray for the closing of the accounting books and getting it audited.
- **11 Malawi:** We seek God's guidance in the new fiscal year that we have just started.
- **12 Canada:** Today is Thanksgiving Day in Canada. We have much to be thankful for, this year even more so.
- **13** Canada: Please pray as we finalize the Christmas Catalogue, as it is mailed, emailed and posted on the website. Please pray for all the details to be in place and that the printing goes smoothly.
- **14** International: The International Board will be having their end of year Board meeting mid-October. Praise God with us for our Board members, their wisdom and guidance in our organization.
- **15** International: The El Council are meeting together today. Please pray. Uganda: The government is reopening schools today for students who are sitting their primary or secondary school exams. Please pray that this reopening will be done safely, and for wisdom as we plan for how we can safely minister to these students.
- 16 Uganda: In September the office went through a process of reevaluating our projects, so that we can restart our ministries under the current COVID-19 conditions. During October we will be sharing these thoughts with our partner churches. Please pray for wisdom, and for strengthened partnerships.
- **17 Haiti:** Daniel Jovin is the EI interim Country Representative in Haiti. He is the headmaster of a school in Canada, a demanding task. Please pray for Daniel as he deals with the demands of both jobs.
- **18 Brazil:** Praise God with us for the medical teams that have finally arrived at the Terena villages to provide assistance in the COVID-19 pandemic. The number of deaths among the Terena people are starting to decrease.
- **19 Uganda:** COVID-19 cases are on the rise in Uganda, with a number of cases in our project area including a pastor and wife who partner with us. Please pray for safety for all of our staff members and their families, and for the churches we partner with.
- **20 Philippines:** The Northview Christian Fellowship hope that we will be able to meet at the new Barangay hall in the month of October. Please pray as we resume The Mailbox Club lessons for our children's program on Saturdays. Please pray for wisdom on how to carry out the program under the new normal.
- **21 Tanzania:** Elisha plans to travel to Ukerewe to follow up with the chicken group in Nansole. One of the group members has been disconnected. Pray Elisha is able to reconcile the situation peacefully.

- **22 Malawi:** Let's pray for EBCM's programs as COVID-19 cases continue to drop. This year's AGM was cancelled. Pray that God will provide a space for an equally effective platform to happen.
- **23** International: El has a new tagline for our media: *Partnering* with churches in serving their communities. We thank God for the perseverance of our El Council who, after some months of detailed discussion, agreed together that this tagline gives a first glance into our organization.
- **24 Tanzania:** The Strength and Dignity project is transitioning into phase two. Please pray that this will go well.
- 25 United States of America: Please pray for Mark's wife, Sherry, and her mom, Joanne. Joanne's condition continues to deteriorate and she is sleeping less and less, which means Sherry sleeps less and less. Several times Joanne has fallen onto the floor and once Sherry was not able to pick her up so she had to call 911 to have someone come and help her back into bed. Sherry is looking for alternatives for her Mom's care and we pray that we find the right place for her.
- **26** Haiti: Please pray for our staff, our work and the country of Haiti.
- **27 Tanzania:** Palapala will be harvesting many watermelons during the month of October for the entrepreneurship project!
- **28** International: We partner with churches in the project countries where we work. Please pray for our partner churches. Our relationships with them are good but please pray that this will grow and develop even stronger. Also pray for potential new partnerships that are being investigated.
- **29 United Kingdom:** September was the end of the fiscal year. Please pray as we start preparing the financial documents, ready for the accountants.
- **30** South Africa: The wife of Letson, one of our board trustees, has lost her job at one of the local primary schools. The school may have to close as well so pray that they could find work for her and that they could stay in the house they are renting.
- **31 Brazil:** The Terena Bible School leaders and students are very happy with the online classes, now that they have better access to internet and a good quality TV. We praise God for that and for the funds He provided that enabled the Bible School to improve the classes, even being in quarantine.
